ABBREVIATIONS.

The Abbreviations used on Ordnance Plans as shown in the following tables are of two kinds, viz., those used for describing boundaries, and those used for describing objects. They are used singly or in combination. The following are examples of combined abbreviations:—

AREAS.

Each enclosure on a *statute* Plan has a reference number, and the area is given under it on the plan, thus:—

194

In Ireland, reference numbers are not printed, but the areas are given separately for each Townland.

In order to facilitate the publication, the numbers and areas of roads, rivers, railways, &c., do not extend beyond the marginal lines of Plans—except in cases where it is clearly shown by position of the number; and where plans are filled in from others of a different County projected on a different meridian.

In the case of towns and large villages encircled by a band of colour or stipple, one number and area only are given for the portion within the band, unless they are contained in more than one parish or Townland, in which case a number is given for the portion included in each parish.

The areas were formerly given in a Book of Reference, which is now being superseded by the insertion of the areas on the plan in all new editions.

The areas are computed to the centre of fence, or other boundary of enclosure, except in the following cases:—

(1). When the fence or other boundary is also the boundary of a Parish or other Civil Division, which does not follow the centre of the fence, the area is calculated to the Parish or other boundary, and not to the centre.

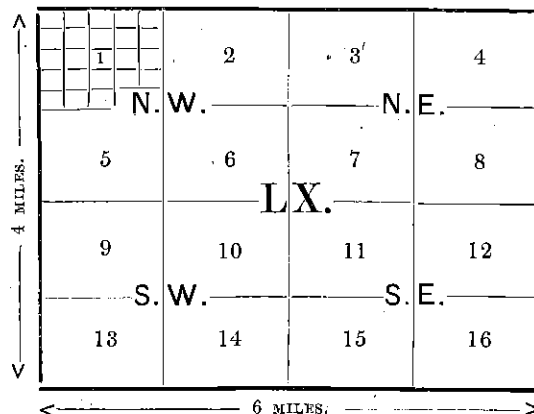
(2). The fences &c., bounding either side of a railway are included wholly within its area.

The Six-inch sheets of each county are numbered from north to south by Roman numerals, e.g., LX.

The outer lines of the above diagram represent one full six-inch sheet, the six-inch quarter-sheets are composed of four $\frac{1}{2500}$ plans, and bear the numerals of the full sheet, of which they form a part, with the addition of the initial letters N.W., N.E., S.W., S.E., according to the position they occupy on the full sheet, e.g., Quarter-sheet LX. N.E. on the above diagram includes plans 3, 4, 7, and 8.

The $\frac{1}{2500}$ Plans, of which it will be observed there are 16 in the above diagram, are numbered 1 to 16, in Arabic figures, and in speaking or writing of any one of them, it is quoted thus—e.g., LX. 9.

There are 25 Plans of the $\frac{1}{5000}$ scale in one $\frac{1}{2500}$ scale plan, as shown in the above diagram, see plan LX. 1 in the N.W. corner, they are numbered from left to right on the same principle as that adopted for numbering $\frac{1}{2500}$ plans, and in speaking or writing of any one of them it is quoted thus—e.g., LX. 1. 9.

In the Isle of Man, the datum is the Mean Water at Douglas.

The Altitudes on the Plans of Ireland are given in feet above Low Water at Spring Tides at Poolbeg Lighthouse, Dublin Bay.

Those indicated thus (B.M. 57.4) refer to marks made on Buildings, Walls, &c.
